GET OR REPLACE YOUR MBTA REDUCED FARE PASS

First- time applicants, seniors (over 65) need to bring:

1. A copy of **ID showing** their **birth date**, such as a driver's license, Mass ID, birth certificate, or passport.

2. Fifty cents (cash only, no checks) The new passes will be mailed to you.
