Starting January 1, 2006, prescription drug coverage will be available for all people in Medicare. This new benefit is the largest change in Medicare's history and every Medicare beneficiary will be affected in some way.

**Everyone on Medicare** will need information about Medicare Part D, the **new**, optional, Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit. Our program will present the latest information on Medicare Prescription Drug Plans available in our area including costs and enrollment.

# WATERTOWN SENIOR PROPERTY TAX WORK-OFF PROJECT

The town of Watertown is offering the property tax work-off project to senior resident homeowners again this year. This program allows up to ten seniors (age 60 and older) a \$750 deduction from their property tax bill in exchange for 110 hours of work for a Town department.

Participants must own and occupy the property for which the taxes are

deducted. In addition, the applicant's skills must match those needed by the participating Town departments. Past projects have included: data entry, filing, or working in the public schools.

The Town gives preference to individuals whose annual income is 300% of the Federal poverty level or less (\$28,710 for one, \$38,490 for 2.)

Copies of your 2003 income tax return may be requested to verify income. Past participants may be considered If space is available.
